# Federal Consistency



## Chapter 380, Part II, F.S.

### Section 380.23, Federal Consistency

(1) When a federally licensed or permitted activity subject to federal consistency review requires a state license, the issuance or renewal of a state license shall automatically constitute the state's concurrence that the licensed activity or use, as licensed, is consistent with the federally approved program. When a federally licensed or permitted activity subject to federal consistency review requires a state license, the denial of a state license shall automatically constitute the state's finding that the proposed activity or use is not consistent with the state's federally approved program...

(6) Agencies authorized to review and comment on the consistency of federal activities subject to state review under the Florida Coastal Management Program are those agencies charged with the implementation of the statutes and rules included in the federally approved program. **Each agency shall be afforded an opportunity to provide the department or the state licensing agency with its comments and determination regarding the consistency of the federal activity with the statutes and rules included in the federally approved program implemented by the agency.** An agency that submits a determination of inconsistency to the department or a state licensing agency shall be an indispensable party to any administrative or judicial proceeding in which such determination is an issue, shall be responsible for defending its determination in such proceedings, and shall be liable for any damages, costs, and attorney's fees awarded in the action as a consequence of such determination.

FCMP consists of a network of 24 Florida Statutes administered by nine state agencies and five water management districts




# 2009 Coastal Zone Management Funding



# Florida Assessment of Coastal Trends

The purpose of the FACT report is to provide useful information to all agencies and organizations managing Florida's resources that impact the coastal area.

**THE FACT CONSISTS OF EIGHT FOCUS AREAS**  
Each Focus area is composed of multiple indicators



Activity	Percentage of Subgroup Indicating Yes	
	Coastal resident	Non-coastal resident
Involved in coastal community activities	44%	28%
Participated in coastal cleanup	64%	60%
Participated in workshop or public meeting	39%	32%
Participated in non-native plant removal	24%	14%



# Beach Access Guide

- Florida's sandy beaches are one of its major attractions for residents and visitors alike. While there are hundreds of miles of sandy beaches, many public access points are under-used because no one knows they exist.
- FCMP is developing an online Public Beach Access Guide with an interactive mapping tool so visitors can match their interests and needs with beach accesses from the Atlantic Ocean to the Gulf of Mexico.

The Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) of 1972 created a unique partnership between federal and state governments with the goal of balancing the conservation of coastal environments with the responsible development of economic and cultural resources. Pending reauthorization of the CZMA has prompted discussions within the coastal community on ways to improve coastal management in the U.S. In response, NOAA's Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management, which administers programs created by the CZMA, and the Coastal States Organization (CSO) undertook a project to engage coastal managers and
