


# State of Minnesota

- Lake Superior Watershed 6200 square miles
- 140 miles of shoreline from Wisconsin border to Ontario (North Shore)
- Major land uses include: Iron Mining, Recreation, Forestry, BWCAW, Urban and Rural Development
- Recreational development along the North Shore and small, private forest acreages are major trends
- Largest Urban Area – Duluth pop: 87,000

# Land Ownership Within Minnesota's Lake Superior Watershed




## Map Legend

# Condition Response Work Plan

- Defined State agency partnership and team members, based on coastal coordination efforts
- Identified preliminary strategies to resolve conditions
- Much coordination between state agencies and local government units to develop responses and enhance working relationships
- Documented existing federal, state and local regulations and programs for planning, implementation and enforcement associated with pertinent Coastal Management Measures

# Coordinate with Federal Partners

- Early teleconference to establish contacts, clarify conditions and define submittal review process.
- NOAA/EPA: Agreed with proposed Work Plan and to review conditions individually by email to expedite process
- NOAA/EPA called and emailed periodically for clarification of state submittals, provided single Condition approvals
- Closing teleconference to discuss remaining Federal Partners' questions and final approval process
- Minnesota supplemental response submittal
